Worship Music this Week:

He Leadeth Me, today's prelude, was written by American Joseph Gilmore in 1862. Soon after his pastoral ordination, he was visiting a Baptist church in Philadelphia where he conducted the Wednesday evening prayer meeting. He used Psalm 23 as the basis for his sermon, thinking particularly of the words He leadeth me beside the still waters from the Psalm. After the service, he had a conversation with his wife and others at the home where he was staying. He said the hymn came as a result of that conversation. Reverend Gilmore described the occasion this way: "During the conversation, the blessedness of God's leadership so grew upon me that I took out my pencil and wrote the hymn just as it stands today, handed it to my wife, and thought no more about it. She sent it, without my knowledge, to a publisher. Three years later I went to Rochester to preach. Upon entering the chapel, I took up a hymn book, thinking, 'I wonder what they sing?' The book opened at He leadeth Me! That was the first time I knew my hymn had found a place among the songs of the church." The first verse and refrain: "He leadeth me: O blessed thought! O words with heavenly comfort fraught! Whate'er I do, where'er I be, still 'tis God's hand that leadeth me. He leadeth me, he leadeth me; by his own hand he leadeth me. His faithful follower I would be, for by his hand he leadeth me."

Deep River, the offertory piece, is a classic example of an African American spiritual, an important genre of music born from the "plantation" and "sorrow" songs of the African American slaves in the Deep South. The song was first printed in the 1876. It is a song of hope and longing, expressing a desire for peace and freedom both in the present and in the afterlife. The songs were created vocally by groups of slaves working in the fields and gathering at camp meetings. The lyrics say: "Deep River, my home is over Jordan. Deep River, Lord; I want to cross over into campground. Oh, don't you want to go to the Gospel feast; that Promised Land where all is peace? Oh, deep River, Lord; I want to cross over into campground."
