Worship Music this Week:

The prelude today is a combination of a praise song and a hymn composed by Englishwoman Helen Lemmel (who later moved with her family to Seattle, Washington.) The congregation will sing the first song that is part of the arrangement (*Shine, Jesus, Shine* with a different title in our hymnal.) The words of the refrain for the other song included in Tom Fettke's arrangement are: "Turn your eyes upon Jesus, look full in His wonderful face; and the things of earth will grow strangely dim, in the light of His glory and grace." (Helen Howarth Lemmel, 1922; Public Domain) The Word in Music, *Behold He Comes*, is an up-tempo medley of three songs: *Days of Elijah, Hallelujah! What a Savior*, and *It is Well with My Soul*. I particularly like part of the text in Days of Elijah – "Behold He Comes, riding on a cloud, shining like the sun, at the trumpet's call . . ." for this Transfiguration Sunday.

The offertory piano arrangement is also a blend of an old hymn and a "contemporary" song. The first, My Jesus, I Love Thee, was composed by a Wesleyan Methodist man from Montreal at the time of his conversion to Christianity. The text: "My Jesus, I love thee, I know thou art mine; for thee all the follies of sin I resign; my gracious Redeemer, my Savior art thou; if ever I loved thee, my Jesus, 'tis now." (William Featherstone, 1864; Public Domain) The second song is in our current hymnal, Glory to God. It is a song of adoration, saying: "I love you, Lord and I lift my voice, to worship you, oh my soul rejoice. Take joy, my King, in what you hear; may it be a sweet, sweet sound in your ear." (Laurie Klein, 1978; House of Mercy Music)
