#### Worship Music this Week:

Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing was composed by 18th century pastor and hymnodist Robert Robinson at the age of 22 in 1757. The hymn appears in many songbooks to this day, including Glory to God, our current hymnal. The text for the first verse:" Come, Thou Fount of every blessing, tune my heart to sing Thy grace; streams of mercy, never ceasing, call for songs of loudest praise. Teach me some melodious sonnet, sung by flaming tongues above. Praise the mount, I'm fixed upon it, mount of Thy redeeming love." (Public Domain)

The Word in Music, Blessed Be the Name, is a gospel hymn written by two people in 1910: William Clark penned the verses; Ralph Hudson wrote the refrain. The choral arrangement the Trinity Choir is singing today is arranged by Tom Fettke in 12/8 time.

The offertory piece, Blessed Be Your Name, was composed by Matt and Beth Redman (Thankyou Music, 2002.) Some of the text says: "Blessed Be Your Name in the land that is plentiful, where Your streams of abundance flow, blessed be Your name. Blessed Be Your name when I'm found in the desert place, though I walk through the wilderness blessed be Your name. Every blessing You pour out, I'll turn back to praise. When the darkness closes in, Lord, still I will say, blessed be the name of the Lord, blessed be Your name; blessed be the name of the Lord, blessed be Your glorious name!"
