Welcome, Rev. Henry!

In Pastor Scott's absence today, we welcome Rev. Tracey Henry. A native of Northern Ireland, Tracey has been living and working in the United States since 2000. A one year internship, sponsored by the Presbyterian Church in Ireland, lead her on a path to ministry which she had never thought possible. 

The author and composer wrote the first stanza and folk-style tune after attending a Bible study on Matthew 6:33. The later stanzas, based respectively on Matthew 7:7 and Matthew 4:4 emerged anonymously. Such meditative singing of scripture is an important form of sung prayer.
