- Laminate the mats and use with a dry-erase marker




Have your little one name each letter. Then have them sort the letters into the correct columns.


#### Extension activities


- Hide the letters in a sensory bin before your little one finds them. Some great sensory bin fillers include rice, dried pasta, beans, crinkly paper, cheerios, etc.
- Have your little one write the letters on the sorting mat in the correct spot. If you laminate the mats first or put them in a clear plastic sheet, your little one can use a dry-erase marker and reuse them over and over.
- Match the uppercase and lowercase letters together.
- Use the letters to spell simple CVC words (cat, dog, man) or sight words (go, in, to).
- Sort the letters into consonants and vowels.
- Talk about the beginning sound that each letter makes.
- Play a game of *Memory* by flipping the cards over and trying to get a match of upper- and lowercase.
- Play a game of Go Fish by trying to get a match of upper- and lowercase.
- Make the letters out of shaving cream or in a tray of rice, or form each letter out of play dough.




