## **Handprint Easter Lily**

## **Supplies Needed:**

- 1 sheet of white construction paper
- 1 sheet of yellow construction paper
- 1 sheet of construction paper of your choice. (not green)

**Scissors** 

**Pencil** 

Liquid glue

Green marker, colored pencil or crayon

## Instructions:

- 1. Trace and cut out your child's handprint. You can decide how many lilies you want. Curly the ends of the fingers by rolling the ends around a pencil.
- 2. Cut 3 thin strips of yellow paper about 2" long
- 3. Curly the ends of the yellow strips slightly (like the handprint) and glue the bottoms near the middle of palm so the curled ends are about halfway up the fingers. Only apply glue to the bottom so the ends stick out.
- 4. Let the glue set for a few minutes
- 5. Once the yellow pistil is set, fold the thumb in and roll the handprint loosely and glue.
- 6. Let the rolled handprints set
- 7. Arrange the flowers on the paper to make a bouquet and glue
- 8. Let the glue set.
- 9. Have your child draw a stem and leaves to the flowers using the green markers, pencils or crayons to create a bouquet.
