Rebuilding Together Howard County

Rebuilding Together Howard County has provided free home repairs in Howard County since 1992 and repaired free of charge over 1,250 homes of low-income homeowners. In 2021, it completed 88 home repairs. Due to Covid restrictions, work last year was performed by a combination of handyman and contractors and included door lock replacement, bathroom rehabilitation, installing grab bars in bathrooms, roof repair, wheelchair ramp and chair lift installation, and general repairs to mobile homes. Homeowners were disabled, elderly, female-headed households, and families with children under 18 years of age. The average family income was \$30,278. CMPC has been a sponsor for a number of years. This year CMPC volunteers will be back in action and are planning to work on a home Saturday April 30. 




