Summary of the May 16, 2022 Session Meeting

The Session approved a motion that should the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention upgrade its current covid-19 community level rating for Howard County from medium to high, CMPC will automatically institute an indoor mask mandate as recommended by the CDC.

In other business:

The Session approved a motion from the Property Committee to permit the serving of wine and beer on CMPC premises when specifically requested on a facility use application. It was agreed that a hold-harmless clause covering the church, along with language specifying that no person or organization may profit from such service, would be incorporated into request forms.

Greetings! Once a month the Stewardship Committee hopes to share some interesting information about the work of Christ Memorial Presbyterian Church that is made possible by your gifts. We thank you for your financial support and hope that you can see God at work in our congregation.

Did you know...that on any given Sunday we have dozens of families that livestream our worship service? I bet you also didn't know that we sometimes have over a hundred online views after our service ends!

Our online worship service enabled us to continue our glorious praise of the Almighty with our faithful congregation during the pandemic and continues to enable CMPC members – near and far – to worship with us when unable to do so in person. Moreover, our livestream worship service offers us the opportunity for outreach to potential new friends of CMPC.

Over the last two years, CMPC has tweaked and improved our online broadcast with additional cameras (for different angled views) and an improved audio system to make each livestream service more dependable and true-to-life. As you may know, much preparation goes into our livestream worship service – from securing and paying for performance rights (to present and record our music offerings), arranging volunteers to man the audio/visual table during the service and the creation of announcement slides that display before/after the livestream, just to name a few.

Of course, the system and these improvements would not have been possible without your generous annual Stewardship dollars, help from a ministry fund endowment and the dedication of so many of our members. There are so many who have given their time and talents to this effort, but we would be remiss if we didn't specifically acknowledge Neil Danzig for all he does behind the scenes, before and on Sundays, to make our livestream worship such a success! 




