The first system of music consists of a vocal line and a bass line. The vocal line is in G major, 3/4 time, and features a melody with a mix of quarter and eighth notes. The bass line provides a harmonic accompaniment with chords and single notes.

The second system of music continues the vocal and bass lines. The vocal line concludes with a final cadence, and the bass line ends with a sustained chord.

In both Hebrew and Greek, the words for “spirit” can equally well be translated as “breath” or “wind,” so it is very appropriate to address the Holy Spirit as the “Breath of God.” This tune by an English organist has become the customary one in North American hymnals.

Drawing on the phrasing of Isaiah 55:12, this joyful sending hymn was created by a musical Canadian father and daughter, beginning with the tune that emerged from a four-hand piano improvisation. The completed hymn later served as the recessional music for her wedding.
