Mission and Local Outreach

In response to Hurricane Ian that has devastated Florida, the Mission and Local Outreach Committee will make a donation to support relief efforts by Hope Force International. They are a faith-based organization working as a first-responder doing clean-up and providing food to low-income families, the elderly, and disabled in and around Cape Coral and Coral Gables, FL. We partnered with Hope Force last year after the hurricane in Haiti.



Fifth Sunday Offering

The Fifth Sunday offering collected on October 30th will go to Bridge of Hope. CMPC has been directly involved with Bridge of Hope for over four years. Bridge of Hope focuses its efforts primarily on single parent families with children. Did you know that many young children experience homelessness? According to the US Dept of Health and Human Services, over 1.4 million children under age 6 experienced homelessness in 2018...that's one-in-16 children under six years old! Many parents who experience homelessness are youth and young adults ages 18-25. Homelessness hurts the health, development and education of children. The Covid pandemic has brought many of these challenges to the forefront. Disparities by race and ethnicity also continue to grow.

How can we begin to make a difference with such a huge problem? Bridge of Hope does it one family at a time! You can help locally by supporting Bridge of Hope Greater Baltimore Region. With the support of individuals and churches like CMPC, Bridge of Hope staff and Neighboring Volunteers can assist and walk with families on their journey to stability from homelessness.

Summary of the Oct. 17 Session Meeting

The Session agreed to hold a Congregational Meeting after worship service on Sunday, Nov. 13 for the purpose of electing officers to serve on the Session and the Board of Deacons in the Class of 2025.

In other business:

- Pastor Hoffman reported that 20 church volunteers are working to finalize interviews with CMPC households to get members' thoughts on what the church's priorities should be, now and into the future. Special-interest group sessions and town hall meetings are being planned for the next phase of the visioning process.
- The 2023 Stewardship Campaign will hold its first in-person events in three years throughout November, due to the pandemic, and will build on the theme "We Are an Offering." More details to come.
- Work is ongoing on the sanctuary humidity issue with a recently-hired contractor set to begin performing tests on our HVAC system within two weeks.
