Mission in Action

In response to the horrific violence against civilians caused by the ongoing Israel-Hamas war, The Mission and Local Outreach Committee has pledged \$2,000 to support relief efforts by Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA). PDA has approved solidarity grants and is supporting local partners in a wide array of emergency interventions, including medical supplies, shelter, WASH (water, sanitation and hygiene), food and non-food items and delivering psychosocial support to individuals. One of PDA's partners is Gaza's Ahli Hospital which was recently bombed causing hundreds of innocent casualties. We invite members of the congregation to join this effort by writing a check or going online to make a contribution. Also, please pray for the safety of hostages, a cease fire, reconciliation, and an end to the violence.

Summary of the Oct. 16, 2023 Session Meeting

The Session agreed to call a Congregational Meeting for Sunday, Nov. 19 after worship service to vote on the Nominating Committee's slate of 12 officers for the Class of 2026. There are three new candidates for the office of Elder, with three current Elders returning for a second three-year term, and there are six new candidates for the office of Deacon.

In other business:

- The 2024 Stewardship Campaign will kick off Sunday, Oct. 22 with the theme, "Good Stewards of God's Love." A goal of expanding the number of people who pledge to help reach a 10 percent increase in dollars pledged over 2023 was announced.
- The Hunger Task Force that grew out of our Visioning Project was scheduled to meet Oct. 17 to discuss their research on what's available now and how people access aid in order to hone in on how CMPC can best fit into the existing network of services.
- More work on rectifying the ongoing humidity issue in the sanctuary took place Oct. 16 with a "blower door test" to check for air leaks. It was determined that outdoor air infiltration within the light cove area is likely the main culprit. How to best remedy that issue is under study.
- The Session agreed to hold brainstorming sessions on increasing facility usage to further the outreach goals set in our Ministry Expansion Plan, beginning with a committee lunch meeting in conjunction with the Annual Officers' Retreat in mid-January. More details to come.

O for a Thousand Tongues to Sing 610



This text comes from an eighteen-stanza hymn the author wrote to mark the first anniversary of his life-changing conversion experience. It is now customarily the first hymn in Methodist hymnals worldwide. This tune, adapted from a German composer, is the usual North American setting.



Both the words and the music of this prayer-song were written by a Presbyterian minister from Tarboro, North Carolina. The words were initially inspired by Jeremiah 18:1–6; a friend helped him set them to music during an evangelistic meeting in Orlando, Florida, where the song was first sung.



Written to highlight the promises made by the author's daughter and two sons at their confirmation, this text equally well recalls the promises of discipleship made in Baptism and in the Reaffirmation of the Baptismal Covenant. The tune was written for a text now unused.



Not everything that looks like a battle ends up being one. This text, written for a seminary graduation, works well with its martial tune in the first stanza; but later stanzas turn from such imagery and focus on "deeds of love and mercy" and courage for life's journey.
