NEWS from the CMPC Hunger Task Force

Where are the food insecure in our community?

- They are all around us, some are probably even our neighbors and friends. No doubt, each of us have likely seen the food insecure in our community.
- They are employed and unemployed, college educated or not, people of skilled trades, students and children
- In Howard County 23.1% of school students receive Free and Reduced Meals (FARMs).
- FARMs is a federal program for students to receive free or discounted breakfast and lunch, based on qualification for SNAP or by family income guidelines.
- Near CMPC, here are the percentage of students who receive FARM benefits:
 - o Atholton High School: 16.4%
 - o Oakland Mills and Hammond High Schools: 36%
 - o Stevens Forest Elementary: 52%
 - o Talbott Springs Elementary: 50%
 - o Cradlerock Elementary: 49%
 - o Oakland Mills Middle School: 45%

The CMPC Hunger Task Force continues to learn about the food insecurity in our surrounding community and where there are places for us to get involved. We **already contribute** and continue to need support for:

Grassroots Day Resource Center meals:

CMPC contributes and serves meals on the 4th Monday every month. NEW Volunteers to cook casseroles and contribute other food like salad and dessert, as well as to serve, are always welcome.

Cold Weather Shelter:

CMPC has been contributing to this program for many years. Since the pandemic, unhoused families have been sheltered in hotels, and we provide meals. This past year, our congregation again served the week between Christmas and New Years.

Mission and Local Outreach has also **contributed funds** on behalf of CMPC to the following organizations working to combat food insecurity:
