Now the apostles and the brothers and sisters who were in Judea heard that the gentiles had also accepted the word of God.² So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers[a] criticized him, ³ saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?"⁴Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, ⁵ "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners, and it came close to me.⁶ As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. ⁷ I also heard a voice saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat.'⁸ But I replied, 'By no means, Lord, for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' ⁹But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made clean, you must not call profane.' ¹⁰ This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven.¹¹ At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. ¹² The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us.[b] These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. ¹³ He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; ¹⁴ he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.'¹⁵ And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning.¹⁶ And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.¹⁷ If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?"¹⁸ When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the gentiles the repentance that leads to life."

Nancy Whitelock

Nancy and Herb Whitelock were married in 1959 and moved to Allview Estates in 1965. They joined CMPC that year. The couple lived there until 2001 when they moved across Route 29 to Hickory Crest, a 55-plus community. Herb passed away in 2006.

Nancy recently retired from serving on the Membership Committee. She was a greeter on Sunday mornings and made sure the mugs that are handed out to visitors were ordered and filled with information about the church.

During her early church years, she taught Sunday school and her three children – Stuart, Keith and Diane – all attended. She initially taught a preschool class and later a third-grade class. She was a member of the Women of the Church, a group that held activities and luncheons, assisted with potluck suppers, and provided homemade cookies during coffee hours on Sundays. She was the group's Social Chairman for a time.

Nancy's interests are gardening, crafts and genealogy. She traced her Maryland family to the early 1700s and discovered a historic family cemetery. She was able to get the tombstones repaired that could be found, and to have the cemetery identified with a new stone marker.

One of her favorite memories is the celebration and brunch on April 25, 2010 when we marked CMPC's 50th anniversary as an important part of the community.

The Monday Morning Women's Bible Study



GIFT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT




GIFT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT
