Jim and Margie Pierce

Jim and Margie Pierce became a vibrant part of CMPC when they joined in September 1963. They moved to Frederick this past December.

Jim worked in computers as a software and systems engineer. He likes doing jigsaw puzzles and playing computer adventure games. Margie enjoys painting and crocheting and was a teacher before retiring to raise their children.

Jim served as a deacon for one term, an elder for five terms and as Clerk of Session from 1988 to 1991. He served as Sunday School superintendent in 1972, with Margie as full-time advisor, and chaired the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) that nominated Steve Carter to be our senior pastor in 2002. More recently, he served on the finance, ad hoc facilities, and membership committees. Jim is a fount of knowledge when it comes to CMPC history and was helpful in writing trivia questions for slides used during the pandemic.

Margie taught Sunday School and was a member of the Women of the Church, which was a popular organization. She served on the PNC that nominated Rick Tatum to be our senior pastor in 1987.

Their daughter Chris and her husband Dave Wruck were active at CMPC for 25 years. Their daughter Sharon and her husband Dave Reith have been active in Methodist churches in Maryland, Virginia and Nevada. The Pierces have five grandchildren and one great-granddaughter.

Thinking back over the years, Jim said one of his favorite memories was the 1972 opening of the new building addition housing the sanctuary and classrooms. That expansion meant the church no longer had to hold overflow Sunday School classes in the boiler room, kitchen and pastor's study, he recalled.

A cherished memory for both of them, Jim said, is the deep satisfaction they each got from working on a PNC and the way "members with various starting positions came together in a very focused effort resulting in a unanimous choice of candidate to present to the congregation. That is God at work."

This sweeping paraphrase of Psalm 29 conveys a sense of the Jewish reverence for the sheer power of God's name, regarded as too holy for mortal tongues to pronounce. In keeping with its appointment for Trinity Sunday, the final stanza gives the psalm a Christian interpretation.







Written for the 500th anniversary of John Calvin's birth, this text sums up his liturgical theology, ending each stanza with his motto: *Cor meum tibi offero, Domine, prompte et sincere*. By moving from plural to singular the stanzas show how corporate faith becomes personal piety.



This hymn is a 21st-century adaptation of the traditional Celtic prayer style known as a *lorica* (Latin for "armor" or "breastplate"). Many such petitions for God's presence and protection were never written down, but this one is based on an example attributed to St. Patrick.
